Fund description

The Fund invests in a diversified group of international equity managers. The Fund utilises the Fiducian "Manage the Manager" process, carefully selecting best of breed managers with different styles, sector and geographical exposures with the aim of achieving superior returns with reduced risk.

This Fund gives investors exposure to the growth of major global economies through investment in international companies. A currency overlay manages the exposure to international currencies.

International share investment can be volatile over the short term, and the recommended holding period is at least 8 years.





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Market Commentary and Outlook

The global economy is expected to slow marginally this year, according to the latest forecast provided by the International Monetary Fund (IMF). This year, global growth is forecast at 2.8% and 3.0% in 2026, which is below the IMF's previous forecast of 3.3% each year (around the long-term trend rate). In the IMF's words, this lowering of its growth forecasts is due to 'the swift escalation of trade tensions and extremely high levels of policy uncertainty', after 'a series of new tariff measures by the US and countermeasures by its trading partners'. The IMF adds that 'while the situation remains fluid, risks remain firmly tilted to the downside', although 'if countries de-escalate from their current tariff stance, the outlook could immediately brighten'.

Uncertainty surrounding US trade policies has caused market volatility in recent weeks, but the broad US stock market (S&P 500 Accumulation Index) rebounded by 6.3% over the month. The Australian market (ASX 200 Accumulation Index) rose 4.2% over the same period, benefiting from a deescalation of trade conflict and a view that domestic interest rates are likely to be lowered. The Australian dollar gained 0.5% relative to the US dollar. Most commodity prices rose, with Thermal Coal (+6.0%) the standout.

Until recently, key global share markets had been 'pricing-in' a shift by central banks towards less restrictive monetary policy, which led to strong returns for equity investors. However, equity markets fell heavily in the lead up to and after the announcement in early April that the US would be implementing hefty tariffs on most imports. Share markets are likely to be volatile in this environment but could rebound as and when an improved balance in international trade relations can be achieved.

Fund Commentary

The Fund gained 5.5% in May, which was above the index return of 5.3% for the MSCI World ex-Australia Index (in AUD). Over the month, the Fiducian Technology Fund (+9.0%) was the top performer, followed by Franklin Growth Mandate (+6.3%).

For the 12 months to the end of May, the Fund rose by 13.3%. Challenger (+17.9%) has been the best performer over the period followed by Vanguard Emerging Markets Index Fund (+16.4%).

The Fund remains strongly diversified, with 14 underlying managers and exposure to over 50 different countries and a broad range of industries. The United States and Europe remain the largest regional exposures by virtue of their size in global markets. The largest regional tilt is towards Asian equities (predominantly India), which offer relatively high earnings growth rates, and overall, the Fund has a marginal overweight exposure to emerging markets relative to developed markets.
