



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Market Commentary and Outlook

The broad Indian stock market had a modest pullback in August. Large cap stocks declined by 1.9%, however, mid cap stocks rose by 2.6% and small cap stocks gained 6.1%. The top performing sectors for the month were Consumer Durables (+4.2%), IT (+4.1%) and Telecom (+3.2%). Oil and Gas (-5.0%), Banks (-4.0%) and Consumer Discretionary (-2.7%) recorded declines.

Economic data released during the month continued to be positive, supporting forecast GDP growth of around 6%-7% for the coming year. Business activity and investment continued to expand, and the latest measures of activity in both manufacturing and services industries remained close to peaks. In a sign of the ongoing development of the aerospace industry in India, on August 23, the India Space Research Organisation announced the successful moon landing of the Chandrayaan-3 spacecraft, making it only the fourth country to achieve this feat.

The corporate sector remains very healthy. Recent quarterly profit announcements have generally been in line or slightly above expectations, with strength being observed in the consumer staples, automotive and industrials sectors with manufacturing output expanding strongly. Revenue growth has moderated, particularly for export focused industries. However, falling input costs (from lower commodity prices) have assisted with profitability. Current market forecasts are for strong earnings growth this financial year.

The economic backdrop for the Indian market remains broadly positive. Company earnings are growing, government policy reform is ongoing, monetary and fiscal policy remains supportive and an increase in capital spending is being seen across many industries. The forecasts for real GDP growth for the coming year remain among the strongest in the world. However, the market could continue to be affected for a time by generally slower global economic growth.

Fund Commentary


The Fiducian India Fund gained 3.8% in August, which was above the 1.1% return for the index (in Australian dollar terms). Over the last 12 months the Fund has gained 11.6%, compared to the index return of 9.7%. Large cap managers Tata (+17.3%) and SBI (+16.3%) have been the top performers over the last year.

The top stock contributors for the month included restaurant platform Zomato, Chemplast Sanmar and Persistent Systems. The main detractors were in the banking sector and included HDFC Bank, State Bank of India and ICICI Bank.

The most significant sector tilts in the Fund remain overweight positons in the Industrials and Financials sectors, which are set to benefit from the strong anticipated growth in the domestic economy, and underweight positions in the IT and telecommunications sectors, where underlying fund managers are broadly expecting a less positive growth outlook relative to other parts of the market, along with the more volatile resources sector. Companies with exposure to the capital spending cycle, as well as the manufacturing sector are also expected to perform strongly in the medium term.
